

Practitioner Development Programs Lead

This leadership role will be responsible for Sport Scientist Canada's two practitioner development programs. There will be a new alternating schedule (each program running every 2 years).

- Women in Sport Science Mentorship Program (odd years)
- LEAD Leadership Program (even years)

Purpose of the role:

To provide managerial oversight and promote programs that attract, develop, and retain world-leading sport scientists equipped with the competencies to work with athletes, coaches, and sport organizations within a multidisciplinary team.

This role is designed to be a career-building experience. We expect significant learning and skill progression of the person holding this role. Contributing to the development of practitioners at all levels should be a central driver for the successful candidate.

Deliverables:

- Chair the selection committee(s) and lead the selection process
- Communicate with participants over the course of the program
- Attend in-person components of the programs
- Attend online program content (where appropriate)
- Work with course facilitators to build new materials and revise content each year
- Conduct program surveys and review feedback with facilitators and committee
- Maintain mentorship and leadership resources as required
- Support Community of Practice sessions in collaboration with the Health and Sciences Discipline Leads
- Take part in practitioner development meetings and provide updates as appropriate
- Contribute to Sport Scientist Canada website updates as appropriate

Term: 2 years, part-time flexible hours

- The position will require a minimum of 4-6 hours per week on average with more commitment required at specific times in the year.
- Workplan and executing deliverables are managed by the Lead. Deadlines for deliverables will occur in accordance with program dates.



Eligibility:

- I. Be of good standing with the relevant certification body for a sport science or sport medicine discipline
- II. Hold a Sport Scientist Canada Membership (Professional or HP Certified)
- III. Possess a minimum of 3 years working at 0.5 FTE or more with a national sport organization or for a Canadian Sport Institute/Centre or multisport organization in a high performance environment as a practitioner with Olympic and/or Paralympic programs
